

ALTAR SERVERS

Altar serving is open to anyone who has made their First Holy Communion with no upper age limit. An Altar Server's job is to help the priest at Mass and other services. After serving a while and mastering the basic tasks, the Parish Priest will conduct a short, special ceremony where new servers will join the Guild of St Stephen usually on St Stephen's Day. Once invested the server can wear the Guild Medal.

CATECHESIS: FIRST COMMUNION, CONFIRMATION & RCIA

Catechesis is a ministry of teaching and forming the faith of children, young people and adults through the Word of God and the teachings of Christ. Catechists have particular responsibility for Sacramental Preparation, and prepare courses for Confirmation, First Holy Communion and Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA). First Holy Communion runs each year for pupils in year 4 and above whilst the

Confirmation programme runs every two years. The next cohort will begin September 2023 for those in years 8 -13. Both programmes consist of around 12 sessions over a six-month period, some sessions involving parental participation. RCIA is available every year on enquiry to Fr James, Deacon Quentin or Ellaine Crome.
