JOHN BRADBURNE PILGRIMAGE WALK 2024

Saturday 8th June 2024

This year JBMS will be climbing Cross Fell. This is the highest mountain in England outside the Lake District. John Bradburne climbed and wrote about it many times in his poetry. The summit is just 5 miles from Skirwith where John was born and spent his early years.

We start at Kirkland church, walk to Wythwaite then up Grumply Hill to Wildboar Scar and on to the summit where we stop for lunch and prayers.

11 miles and 2400 feet of ascent which will take approximately 6 hours. You will need to be fairly fit and dressed for a boggy walk with possibly a cold wind, even in June.


Before the walk, there will be a Mass held at St John the Evangelist Church, Skirwith, CA10 1RQ at 10am. All welcome to join the Mass.

st cedd 'evensong'



As a unique event, we are 'reconstructing' as best as we are able an evening service (Compline) such as St Cedd himself would have sung in the Chapel (St Peter on the Wall) that he founded c. AD 654 at Bradwell.

Do join us and contribute to the success of this historic occasion!

The service is on Sunday 7 July 6pm, with a rehearsal that afternoon. There are two preliminary rehearsals on Saturday 1 June 10am and Saturday 22 June 10am.

You need:

To be able to read music (because of limited rehearsal time) To attend the rehearsal on 7 July

To attend at least one (but preferably both) of the two preliminary rehearsals
